Dr. Rhodes presentation will focus on his involvement with the development of commercial nuclear power since the late 1960's - with particular focus on the history of Virginia Power. He will also discuss his thoughts on the future of nuclear power from the context of his long career and experiences in the nuclear industry.

Speaker Biography:

Jim Rhodes has more than 50 years of experience in the energy industry. He retired as chairman, president and chief executive officer of the Institute of Nuclear Power Operations (INPO), serving from 1998 to 2001. Prior to that, he served as president and chief executive officer of Virginia Electric & Power Company in Richmond, Va., from 1989 to 1997, where he rose through the ranks in a 26-year career at the energy company starting as a Nuclear Physicist in 1971. He was previously a project engineer in the U.S. Army nuclear power program and before that, was employed by Martin Marietta's nuclear division.

Rhodes currently serves on the board of directors of Duke Energy Corporation where he is chairman of the Nuclear Oversight Committee. He is a former board member of the Institute of Nuclear Power Operations, Electric Power Research Institute's Advisory Council, Nuclear Energy Institute, Virginia Electric & Power Company, Dominion

Resources Inc., NationsBank N.A. (and predecessor banks), Edison Electric Institute, Southeastern Electric Exchange, Virginia Manufacturers Association, Richmond Renaissance and Greater Richmond Partnership.

Rhodes earned a bachelor of science degree in physics from North Carolina State University in 1963, a master of science degree in nuclear engineering from Catholic University in 1968 and a Ph.D in nuclear engineering from Purdue University in 1972 where he was an Atomic Energy Commission Fellow.
